

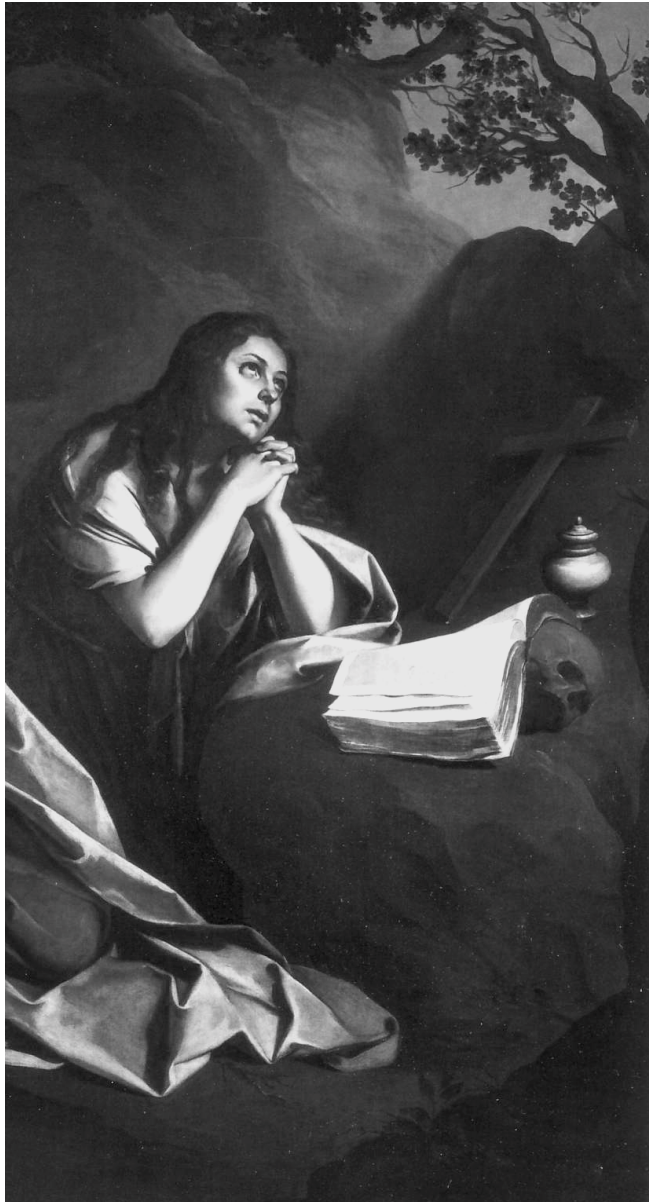

QUESTIONS FOR PERSONAL REFLECTION/GROUP DISCUSSION

1. At times God seems to hide so that we look for him. In what ways is the Lord asking me to search for him right now?
2. What or where is my own “tomb?” And how does Jesus want to help me to look into that by the power of his merciful love?
3. What are my deepest and holiest desires?

QUESTIONS FOR PERSONAL REFLECTION/GROUP DISCUSSION

1. How is Jesus disguised in my own life? Where (and especially, in whom) does he want me to recognize him?
2. St. Mary Magdalene recognized the Lord when he said her name. What do I hear when Jesus says my name?
3. Where am I most tempted to “hold on” to my own idea of Jesus? What does he want to say to me in that?

QUOTATIONS TO HELP YOUR PRAYER

“Incline your ear and come to me, hear, that your soul may live; and I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, merciful love for David. Behold, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples. Behold, you shall call nations that you know not, and nations that knew you not shall run to you, because of the Lord, your God, and of the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you.

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1. What are the most apparent ways the Lord is asking me to be an apostle right now?
2. To whom, specifically, is he sending me?
3. What are the greatest fears I face in that, and how does God want to speak to those fears?
4. What are the greatest external challenges I face in that, and how does God want to speak to those challenges?
5. How present am I as a Christian in the world? What's one way I could be more present this week?
6. How attentive am I to opportunities to share Christ's love with others? What's one way I could be more attentive this week?
7. What is one invitation I could extend to someone this week?
8. Who could help me to discern the answer to the previous questions (perhaps a spiritual director, a family member, or a friend)?
