

The Context of Team Dialogue




The Regnum Christi Team



9. Lay members of Regnum Christi ardently seek to establish and extend the Kingdom of Christ among all people. They let themselves be permeated by Christ's charity towards humanity and bring their apostolic zeal to life through intimate contact with him. They long for Christ to conquer their own souls and the souls of all those around them. Impelled by the Holy Spirit and in the style of St. Paul, they endeavor to be supernatural in their aspirations, magnanimous of heart, audacious in self-giving, tenacious in the face of difficulties, and practical and effective in action. They seek to transform the world in Christ. Their motto is, "Christ our King. Thy Kingdom Come!"

Therefore, the lay members of Regnum Christi:

1. ^o seek to encounter Christ daily in prayer, and to witness to him in the various circumstances of life; 5. ^o start and participate in apostolic initiatives and works, according to their possibilities;

4. ^o take on their responsibility as lay faithful to bring the light of the Gospel into the public, cultural, economic, political, academic and social arenas of life. They also seek to awaken the apostolic commitment of different kinds of leaders in the world, so they live their ethical and religious convictions more coherently.

2. ^o in living their lay vocation, they make it their first priority to live their family life and the duties of their state in life, enlightened by the Word of God and Church teaching;

3. ^o seek to engage others in the concrete realities of their lives to proclaim the Gospel to them and invite them to participate in Christ's mission; the Regnum Christi charism to the local Church;

7. ^o desire to share with others the gift of God they have discovered in Regnum Christi. So they introduce and invite others to Regnum Christi, and accompany those who show an interest in getting to know it, or in participating in its spirituality and mission

Team Dialogue

What Team Dialogue is

- An opportunity to speak one on one with each member entrusted to your care about their life in Regnum Christi and show how much you value the member
- It is important to keep in mind that life in Regnum Christi cannot be limited to a series of means, activities or regular meetings. It is above all a loving relationship with Christ in the Church, that imprints on us a particular style of Christian life and urges us to do apostolate according to each person's circumstances and possibilities, using the means that God gives each one.







Forums for Dialogue

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Questions one might ask?

- How do you feel the Encounters w/ Christ are going? Do you find them engaging? (If the answer is no, ask them what would help improve their experience?)
- How is your relationship with the other men/women on the team?
- How are they living their apostolic life? How is their apostolic work-life balance? Is it too much work, not enough? Do they need a new challenge?
- Are they participating in the life of the section?
- Are you able to see your spiritual director on a regular basis? (if not why? Is it them or the Spiritual Director? Are they happy w/ their SD? Do they need a new one? (Members do not need to disclose who they see, only that they have access to one as often as they need and it is a good relationship).
- Where along the path is this member in their formation journey?
- What are they doing to continue to grow in their understanding of the catholic faith and their life in Regnum Christi?
- Do they have a particular interest they would like to study or explore?
- Are they aware of and utilizing the resources within the Formation Pathway?

Apostolic Dialogue - a specific form of dialogue

It is meant for both accompaniment within the work of apostolate and a means for accountability. The nature of the meeting is around the action plan/ program for the apostolate.

Questions center around the work itself and the person doing the work.

- How is execution of the plan, any challenges the leader is facing, any ways the Section Leadership can support the work.
- How's the work life balance of the apostle? Are they tired, burned out or thriving?
